Dr. Marilyne Jollineau's exceptional service to the Canadian Association of Geographers has made significant and lasting contributions to the profession of geography. Dr. Jollineau is an outstanding advocate for the CAG. She encourages students and colleagues alike to join the Association, and provides necessary support for students to attend and present at the annual meetings.
